

With all the methods thieves have at their disposal, be aware and cautious when using your ATM or debit card, and keep your money out of the hands of fraudsters.

According to BALANCE, one popular method thieves are turning to involves skimmers. Skimmers are card-reading devices fraudulently attached to the card slots of legitimate ATMs. These unnoticeable devices allow the ATM to operate normally while permitting thieves to steal account information. Skimmers read your card information, and a hidden camera or keyboard overlay device captures your PIN. Criminals can then use your information for fraudulent transactions.

TFCU checks our credit union owned ATMs regularly for tampering, but these

ATM fraud keep your accounts safe

are steps you can take to keep your accounts safe from fraud:

- Before inserting your card, wiggle the card slot. If it moves, there may be a skimmer on it. Alert your financial institution immediately.
- Avoid using ATMs in remote or strange locations.
- Use the same ATM during daytime hours for all your transactions. You are more likely to notice if the machine has

been tampered with.

- Be aware of your surroundings, and look over your shoulder before entering your PIN number.
- Check your accounts often for fraudulent activity. Notify TFCU immediately if you see anything suspicious.
- Take precautions when using a driveup ATM. Pull up close, keep your car running and lock car doors.

- Credit unions are not-for-profit cooperatives owned by their members and every member has equal ownership. Banks are for-profit, generally family-owned or publicly traded stockholder-owned companies.
- Credit unions are run by unpaid volunteer boards and committees. Members elect, rather than hire, the Board of Directors and the Board represents credit union members in making decisions and upholding policies. Members of a bank Board of Directors receive compensation for their positions.
