thankfulness and recovery rebuilding after the May 20 tornado

On May 20, 2013, employees of the TFCU Moore branch did not know that walking out of work would be so much different than when they arrived. For AVP/Branch Manager Jan Davis, the biggest concern on her mind was if she would stop for coffee on her way in.

After following weather reports, Davis and her staff followed established TFCU safety procedures and sheltered the 14 employees, eight members and one passer-by who came in to get out of the storm, in the safe deposit box vault, which is constructed of steel reinforced, 5-inch-thick concrete walls. The vault was the only part of the TFCU Moore branch left standing after Moore was ravaged by the EF-5 tornado. All those who took shelter in the vault walked away unscathed.

After everyone was reunited with

loved ones, TFCU secured all safe deposit boxes. The vault was under 24-hour security until the boxes were relocated to the Midwest City branch.

TFCU's senior management and board of directors have announced their decision to immediately start the process of rebuilding the Moore branch in the same location.

TFCU officials said they hope to have the new branch completed before the end of this year. The property has already been cleared of debris, and the old foundation has been removed. The new floor plan being finalized will

have some improved traffic flow, while offering the same amenities members enjoyed before. The new building will have over 6,000 square feet, with a safe deposit box vault, Personal Finance Café, Investment Center and children's area inside and six drive-thru lanes and an ATM outside.

"I'm thrilled we are beginning the construction process so soon," said Davis. "I love the Moore community and the people we have served at that branch since opening in 2005. We're very excited to be staying in the same area." ▲

Have you ever wondered what the difference is between a credit union and a bank? Many people don't realize there is a difference between the two. Here are a few of the primary differences between the two types of financial institutions.

- Credit unions are not-for-profit cooperatives owned by their members and every member has equal ownership. Banks are for-profit, generally family-owned or publicly traded stockholder-owned companies.
- Credit unions are run by unpaid volunteer boards and committees. Members elect, rather than hire, the Board of Directors and the Board represents credit union members in making decisions and upholding policies. Members of a bank Board of Directors receive compensation for their positions.
