Unfortunately, not every charity is reputable. Regardless of when and why you choose to donate, selecting the right organization can be challenging. When researching organizations, consider their financial performance. Charities should be upfront about how donated money is spent and be able to provide you with an IRS form 990 that describes the charity's finances. Ethical practices and results should also be reviewed.

A simple internet search can provide much of this information. Luckily, there

are also several resources to help you review charities and decide where your hard-earned dollars will be most useful.

Charity Navigator (www.charitynavigator.org) is an independent organization that evaluates more than 7,000 charities in the United States. The website features a rating system of one to four stars, rating how well each charity uses the money received.

GiveWell (www.givewell.org) is a nonprofit dedicated to finding outstanding giving opportunities and makes recommenations to help donors decide where to give. GuideStar (www.guidestar.org) is a public charity that collects, organizes, and disseminates information about IRS-registered non-profits. They provide a wealth of information about a non-profit's mission, governance, and much more. GuideStar awards seals of approval to those charities that meet their criteria for transparency and accountability.

Once you have done your research, it really comes down to trust. If you have doubts about a charity, don't contribute to it. Instead, find another organization that does the same kind of work and with which you feel comfortable.

scams to avoid

Scam artists often target vulnerable people who are experiencing financial problems due to job loss, lower wages or higher prices on commodities. If you find yourself in a position where you are falling behind on payments, or your debt load is increasing, don't fall prey to criminals who create fake companies that offer to "clean up" your credit.

While there are legitimate credit counseling agencies that do advise people on how to improve their debt situation, beware of those who offer to erase information from your credit record for a hefty up-front fee. They can't do anything you couldn't do yourself by contacting any of the three major credit reporting agencies: Experian, Equifax and TransUnion. And, if the negative information on your record is accurate, no one can get it removed for at least seven years.

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get the most out of your garage sale

A garage sale can help you make some extra cash, but you've got to treat it like any other business venture. Here are some tips on getting the most out of your event:

- Check out any restrictions your neighborhood or local government may have on yard sales.
- Advertise by placing notices on the Internet and in the local newspaper.
- Put prices on everything. When pricing items, start with the guideline of one-third of what it cost new. But that's just a guideline. That book that cost you \$15 probably won't sell for more than \$3.
- Display the more interesting items for sale at the end of the driveway to lure people in.
- As items get sold, fill in the empty spots on your tables to keep things looking attractive.
- Make sure the items you're selling are in the best possible shape; e.g., put air in that basketball and turn the TV on if you're selling it.
- Put on background music. Stores do this for a reason: It works to keep browsers there longer and more likely to buy.
